

Holly Tree Farm Barns – Things To Do

Ipswich Waterfront (28 miles)

Marina, cafés and bars, festivals and events, boat trips

Ipswich Transport Museum, Ipswich (30 miles)

East Anglia Transport Museum, Lowestoft (20 miles)

Specialising in street transport, with a tramway and trolleybus route. Exhibition halls, tearoom, gift shop.

Greene King Brewery Tour, Bury St. Edmunds (36 miles)

Tour of the brewery, views over Bury St. Edmunds, beer café

Christchurch Mansion, Ipswich (26 miles)

Tudor house with historically accurate room layouts, collections, Gainsborough and Constable paintings

Open Tuesday to Sunday

Covehithe Beach and church (18 miles)

Quiet, almost forgotten beach with crumbling golden cliffs, medieval church and conservation area. Just one of many beaches along the Suffolk coast.

Baylham House Rare Breeds Farm, Baylham, Ipswich (26 miles)

Family day out. Feed the animals, play areas, café, wildlife, local produce.

Jimmy's Farm, Ipswich (34 miles)

Farmyard and more exotic animals and birds. Adventure playground, activities, farm shop, restaurant and coffee house.

Africa Alive Zoological Reserve, Banham, Norwich (20 miles)

100 acre reserve with a wide variety of animals including cheetah, flamingo and giraffe. Safari truck, become a keeper for the day.

Open every day 9.30 until 4pm or 5pm (depending on season).

Rendlesham Forest Centre, Woodbridge (20 miles)

Walking and mountain biking trails.

Places of Interest

Aldeburgh (18 miles)

Small coastal town with fabulous beach. Home to the Aldeburgh Festival and a Literary Festival. Famous fish and chip shop. Large Martello tower, scallop sculpture, boutique shops. Well worth a visit.

Woodbridge (18 miles)

Historic riverside town with great pubs and restaurants. Close to ***Sutton Hoo*** Anglo-Saxon burial site which is also well worth a visit while you're down there.

Southwold (15 miles)

Well kept, lovely seaside town with plenty of restaurants, cafés and pubs. Adnams brewery tour and shop. Take the ferry to Walberswick. Bijou cinema, arts centre, promenade and beach.

Lavenham (38 miles)

Britain's best preserved medieval village, boutique shops and galleries, restaurants, cafés and pubs. Well worth a day to explore.
